Way to go Beverly!!!




Spotlight on Brenda White, Social Butterfly

Did you Know

nology Services, It's always sad to see a school close. Families, students, and staff have strong memories of the years spent at their school, learning and playing. This year, APS will bid farewell to three schools: Barrett Academy, Essex Elementary School, and Rankin Elementary School. This is continuing a trend over the past decade of APS schools that have shut their doors. In all, between 2005 and the end of this school year, 13 schools have been closed or merged into other schools. Some of them live on hosting other programs; others lived temporary lives as swing space for schools being rebuilt; others still sit vacant, waiting for the wrecking ball. It is sad, but it is also the cost of progress.

This isn't the first time APS has had to make some tough choices with our schools. During the 1910s-1920s, Akron

was one of the fastest growing cities in America, thanks to the birth of the automobile and the increased need of our signature product - rubber. APS was building schools at a rapid pace. There was a time during the middle of the last century where if you stood on the roof of the Administration building (itself a school at one point), you could look across the skyline and see almost a dozen schools.

This served us well until the 1970s, when the economy of the city went down with the economy of the country. Late in the decade, APS had to make tough choices, as the District does now. Central High School, the first traditional high school in Akron, and Hower Vocational High School (itself a repurposed elementary school) were merged into and became Central-Hower High School. During the decade, however, the Board was forced to make difficult decisions and ultimately closed or repurposed

11 schools:

➤ South High School (now Miller-South)

► Thornton Junior High (the original South High School, which was replaced by Riedinger Middle School, on the site of the Aldi's on Thornton St.)

➤ West Junior High (originally West High School, now senior apartments)

► Bryan Elementary School (now Glenwood Jail)

➤ Fraunfelter Elementary School (now the Oriana House administration building)

While we hope that we don't have to close too many more schools, it is at least somewhat comforting to know that this isn't the first time Akron has had to make tough decisions as time goes on. We can look to our history and know that during the difficult period of the 1970s, the district came out stronger for those tough decisions, so we can feel confident that we will come out stronger for what is happening today!

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Recipe Section

Ruben Casserole (Makes six servings. Prep time: 15 minutes/Cook time: 20 minutes)

The classic flavors of a Reuben sandwich baked in a casserole!!!

- 1 Package Bob Evans Original Mashed Potatoes (or make your own) - 24 oz. 1/3 Pound thickly sliced corned beef
- (cut into 1/2 inch pieces) (check your local deli)
- 1 Cup shredded Swiss cheese, divided

- 2 Large eggs
- 1/4 Cup milk
- 1 Can sauerkraut, drained (14 oz.)
- 1 Tablespoon spicy brown mustard

Preheat oven to 400F. In large bowl, stir together potatoes, eggs and milk until well combined. Stir in corned beef, sauerkraut and mustard. Set aside 2 tablespoons of cheese. Stir in remaining cheese into potato mixture. Pour into a greased 8 x 8 inch oval baking pan. Top with 2 tablespoons cheese. Bake 15-20 minutes or until top is golden.


Here is a photo Max, he is a 3 year old boxer... and he is sooo AWESOME! (Cortney Porter)
